First Reading: Isaiah 8:23-9:3; Responsorial Psalm 27:1, 4, 13-14 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17; Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

"The Lord is my light and my salvation." (Psalm 27)



Today's readings continue to explore the call to discipleship—the call to serve others as followers of Christ.

Isaiah tells us: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." Following their exile, the Israelites have been freed, and are now able to start a brand new life. God has freed them from the darkness of slavery and oppression. A new light is upon them!

After John the Baptist was arrested, Matthew describes the beginning of Jesus' public ministry along the Sea of Galilee. He begins his ministry with the words

of Isaiah and the Baptist. Jesus announces that a new day has come. God's reign of mercy, peace, and new life brings hope to God's people. Jesus calls his first disciples, Simon and Andrew, and James and John. All four are fishermen, called to become "fishers of men [and women]." They quickly leave behind their nets—their livelihood—to follow Jesus. The fishermen and so many others are filled with hope and promise. God's light shines upon them! Good News is proclaimed and healing takes place for the poor and suffering!

This Third Sunday of Ordinary time invites us to open our hearts to the voice of the Lord, calling us to share in the newness of life—leaving behind all fear and doubt—to live with faith and to belong to Christ. He leads us out of darkness into his wonderful light!

"I belong to Christ." (1 Cor. 1:12)
