First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13; Responsorial Psalm 146:6-10 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:26-31; Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12



"Blessed are the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs!"

Being "poor in spirit" is being disciples of Christ. It means we that we live our lives according to God's will being available to serve God in the poor and oppressed without counting the cost. To be "poor in spirit" calls us to recognize and identify with the challenges and difficulties that our sisters and brothers encounter each and every day. God's dream—and our own hunger and thirst for justice and peace—will only come about if we follow Jesus and strive to live with His compassion, mercy, and love.

Let us receive and welcome others as Jesus Himself. We remember the words of Jesus: "I was a stranger and you welcomed me" (Matthew 25:38). May our "yes" to God—as we make every effort to be "poor in spirit" and live the Beatitudes—enable us be true disciples.
