First Reading: Isaiah 49:14-15; Responsorial Psalm 62:2-3, 6-9 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 4:1-5; Gospel: Matthew 6:24-34

"I WILL NEVER FORGET YOU."-Isaiah 49:15



Isaiah speaks to people who believe they have been deserted by God. With tenderness, the prophet assures them that mothers do not forget their children. But even if a mother should abandon her child, God's love would still stand firm.

In Matthew's Gospel, we are reminded of God's faithfulness and love for us. While life is full of things to be anxious about, we are urged by Jesus to place our confidence and trust in the Father. Jesus tells us: *"Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you more important than they?"* (Mt. 6:26)

We are urged by our Lord to choose wisely and to be trustworthy servants and stewards of God. Appropriately, as we approach Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent, Jesus asks us to decide whom we serve. He tells us: "*No one can serve two masters*." (Mt. 6:24) Is our commitment to God before all else? If so, all will be provided for us. *"But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you besides*." (Mt. 6:33) May Lent be a time for us to set our hearts on God's kingdom and prioritize God before all else. We can be certain that His deep love for us will be revealed in new and surprising ways!

Lenten Dinners


