The History of Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order. The first Carmelites were hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid-13th century. They built in the midst of their hermitages a chapel which they dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Carmelites consider Mary to be a perfect model of the interior life of prayer and contemplation to which Carmelites aspire, as well as a model of virtue, in the person who was closest in life to Jesus. She is seen as the one who points followers of Christ most directly to Him. As she says to the servants at the wedding at Cana, "Do whatever he [Jesus] tells you."


2nd Collection—July 29-30
