
Twenty-Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

The speaker this month will be Dr. Maria Villaseñor, Ph.D., Professor of Ethnic Studies at CSUMB. From the inception of our nation, the ideology of racism has structured American institutions, permeated the national culture, and had grave consequences for our country's citizens. How have the peoples of the U.S. been burdened by racism and its consequences, and what is our shared responsibility to challenge its logic and its systems? God calls us to fight systems preventing the realization of his Kingdom; how might we help dismantle racial hierarchies centuries in the making?

What is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)?

The **RCIA** is a ministry of the Church which begins with the *Period of Inquiry* and enables individuals to learn more about Christ and our Catholic faith. The Inquirer may decide to enter the *Period of the Catechumenate* and participate in a more in-depth and personal process of conversion and growth in faith in preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation. The beautiful and very meaningful process leads to the Easter Vigil and the celebration of Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation and a new life in Christ as members of our Catholic Church.

Adults who are already baptized in another Christian tradition are also welcome to enter **Full Communion with the Catholic Church** by entering into a special period of study and discernment to share in the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Confirmation. **Adult Catholics** who did not receive the Sacraments of the **Eucharist and/or Confirmation** as children or youth are also welcome.


