"Listen to him."

Jesus takes Peter, James and John and leads them on a journey up a high mountain. His appearance changes—he is transfigured before their eyes! Elijah and Moses appear! Peter, with fear, expresses his desire to build three tents. The request is interrupted by the appearance of a cloud and the voice of God: "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Jesus is again alone and soon returns down the mountain with the disciples. What an amazing get away and lesson for Peter, James and John! And us!

We, too, are invited to experience the transfiguration of Jesus and the voice of God speaking to us through our discipleship and especially in every celebration of the Eucharist! The simple gifts of bread and wine are *transfigured* and become our crucified and risen Lord. Jesus becomes one with us and offers us the food that changes us. We receive him and never forget the message of the Father: "This is my beloved Son. LISTEN TO HIM."

Letter to Local, State and National Lawmakers

Last Tuesday evening 15 parishioners responded to the invitation extended at the conclusion of our Masses last weekend to meet for prayer and dialogue about gun violence in our nation. The dialogue was fruitful and led to the writing of the enclosed letter. You are invited to prayerfully consider the possibility of signing the letter next weekend. Parishioners who participated in the preparation of the letter will be in front of the church following our Masses. The letter will then be sent to local, state and national lawmakers.

The meeting last Tuesday began and ended with prayer and included a reading of the Beatitudes of Jesus (Mt. 5:1-12). Along with the letter, issues discussed included: a commitment to support the efforts of the students of Douglas High School in Parkland, as well as the efforts of our own students in Monterey County; mental health services; violence in movies, television and most especially video games; social media issues; families and parental guidance; moral values; and the desensitization to violence in society in general. We agreed that we are sad, tired and angry and hope that we can be moved to act with wisdom and compassion as people of God.

National Call-In Day to Protect Dreamers

The U.S. Bishops are urging Catholics to call Congress and request they act on behalf of "Dreamers," undocumented immigrants who came to the U.S. as minors but have been allowed to stay under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals. "We ask once again that members of Congress show the leadership necessary to find a just and humane solution for these young people, who daily face mounting anxiety and uncertainty," the bishops said in their statement, announcing a national call-in day to protect the Dreamers on Monday, Feb. 26. The call comes after the Senate failed to pass a bill. "Our faith compels us to stand with the vulnerable, including our immigrant brothers and sisters," the bishops said.
