"Do whatever he tells you."

It is touching, yet not surprising, that Mary is so very concerned about protecting the dignity of the couple married in Cana. She tells Jesus, "They have no wine." Jesus responds with compassion and respect for the couple. Like his mother, not wanting them to suffer from ridicule, Jesus transforms jars of water into an abundance of wine! Culturally, wine was expected and a sign of hospitality, joy and, most of all, God's blessing. This first miracle of Jesus is a powerful sign of God's divine love received and shared with the couple and their community.

We remember today the gift and dignity of all people. Isaiah tells us that "as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you." God takes delight in those who respect the dignity of others and share with them the joy of God's divine love. The Spirit and the spiritual gifts that we have received, as Paul tells us, are to be shared for the common good. We do what Jesus tells us. And, then, miracles happen!

Holy Spirit, comforter of hearts, heal your people's wounds and transform our brokenness.

Grant us courage and wisdom, humility and grace, so that we may act with justice and find peace in you.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.


