"New things have come!"

We celebrate today Laetare Sunday—a time for rejoicing—as we share in the joy of the parable of the prodigal son. The beautiful story begins when the Pharisees and scribes complain because the tax collectors and sinners were listening to Jesus. As Paul tells us, "old things have passed away; new things have come!" The youngest of two sons wants freedom from his father and pleads for a share of his estate. He agrees and divides his estate between the two sons. The youngest son spends foolishly all of his inheritance and desperately begins a journey home.

A surprising twist takes place! Jesus tells us, "While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him." He is not turned away, but instead welcomed home with love, forgiveness and a new beginning which includes fine clothing, a ring and a party to rejoice! An amazing reminder of Gods unconditional love! "New things have come!"


