

DAILY GOSPEL READINGS

Nov. 11-15, 2019

Mon: Luke 17:1-6 Tues: Luke 17:7-10 Wed: Luke 17:11-19 Thurs: Luke 17:20-25 Fri: Luke 17:26-37 First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7:22-1-2, 9-14; Psalm 17:1, 5-6, 8, 15; Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5; Gospel: Luke 20:27-38

"They are the children of God...the ones who will rise."--Luke 20:36

Today's readings strengthen our faith that beyond death there is life with God forever. Our first reading from 2 Maccabees describes the faith of eight Jewish martyrs—a mother and her seven sons. The courageous family chose death rather than deny their belief in the resurrection of the dead. Similarly, the Gospel looks at resurrection in the age to come. Jesus tells us that our resurrected life will be completely different than what we know in this life. God's love will transform us!

Paul tells the early church that in the midst of hardship and trials they will be strengthened and protected by their faith in the crucified and risen Lord. Like early believers we journey with hope in what is yet to come. Paul urges us, "May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and the endurance of Christ." As we share in the mission of the saints and martyrs before us we entrust our lives, as Jesus urges us, not to the "God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive!"

Project Update: Maintaining God's House

Good news! With the financial support of the Capital Campaign our architect has achieved approval for our planned remodel through a design review application to the County of Monterey. Our architect is currently working with engineering consultants to establish a structural design and other details necessary to submit an application for a building permit from the County by mid-December. The next step in first quarter 2020 will be construction documents with the detailed finishes and material specifications that will enable contractor bidding. Good progress!


