DAILY GOSPEL READINGS THIS WEEK

"Rise, and do not be afraid."—Matthew 17:7

The readings for this Second Sunday of Lent encourage us to **trust** God and **listen** to his beloved Son. As if that wasn't enough, Jesus himself urges Peter, James, and John, "Rise, and do not be afraid." The Lord approaches his passion and death with love and trust in his Father. He knows that death will not put an end to his mission. His transfiguration is understood in the light of the resurrection. Jesus' radiant transformation anticipates the paschal light!

The hope of the transfiguration—along with the presence of Moses and Elijah—encourages the disciples, and each of us, to follow Jesus and not hold back. Abraham's faith and trust in God, regardless of what he must leave behind, is a powerful example for us. Our commitment to God demands radical faith. Paul urges us, "Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." As we carry the cross of Jesus we experience the transfiguring grace of the Lord's resurrection. With all who have walked with faith before us, may we hear anew, "Rise, and do not be afraid."

CAMBIOS LITURGICOS POR CAUSA DEL VIRUS -


