"Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst."—John 4:14

The unnamed Samaritan woman at the well, in the midst of the scorching midday sun, is thirsty. For water—and much more. She yearns for mercy, understanding, forgiveness and peace. Truly a new life. A life that only Jesus can offer her. He tells the woman, "Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him [her] a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Following an intimate conversation with Jesus, the woman shares her faith in the coming of the Messiah, the Christ. Our Lord informs her, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you." The woman is powerfully transformed and changed by her very personal encounter with Jesus. She quickly goes off to share the good news with others—leaving at the well her water jar! She is a new creation! A precious and sacred vessel of the water that only Jesus can give! We, too, are invited to drink of the Lord's life giving water. As our psalm beautifully urges, "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

<u>A March 12 letter to the Priests of the Diocese of</u> <u>Monterey includes the following:</u>

- Suspend sharing the Precious Blood of Christ;
- Strongly encourage the faithful to refrain from receiving the Eucharist on the tongue;
- No hand holding during the Lord's Prayer;
- No touching during the Kiss of Peace;
- Those who feel uncomfortable or fearful...and those over 60 are not obligated to attend Mass.
- All community events must be either postponed or cancelled, whether these are indoor or outdoors...
- Including Lenten Fish Dinners, Donuts and coffee...any non-essential gathering of any kind.



CAMBIOS LITURGICOS POR CAUSA DEL VIRUS -


