"See how he loved him." - John 11:36

Our very touching readings this Sunday speak of the centrality of the Resurrection in our lives. Jesus tells Martha—and us—"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." This message of life is meant to give us, like Martha, hope and strength as we journey in faith. For those who believe, the love of Christ will always have power over death.

Jesus is saddened by the death of his friend Lazarus and sheds tears of love. He sheds tears of love for us today, too. The reality of the COVID-19 Pandemic touches the Heart of Jesus with the pain of all who suffer from the affects of the virus, the loss of loved ones, as well as the hardship of isolation and fear caused by the virus. The presence of Jesus will always be recognized, "See how he loved him." Jesus is always with us in our acts of love as we reach out in prayer and kindness to comfort and help one another. Like Lazarus, we are his friends; he promises that we "will see the glory of God!"


