As we enter with Christ the holiest of all weeks may our participation, even from home, draw us into deeper union with him and with one another. Todays readings for this Palm Sunday take us from joy and triumph to despair and desolation. Our readings this Sunday and throughout the week urge us to keep in mind Jesus' love for us, his faithfulness and complete trust in God. We may not have palms in our hands, but we begin Holy Week proclaiming the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. His betrayal and passion follow. Paul tells us, "he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave...he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

The days ahead, especially the Holy Easter Triduum that begins on Thursday evening and concludes with the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil, witness the Lord's unconditional love. The love of the Son of God who continues to lift high on his cross the most vulnerable and suffering. A love that that we, too, are called to live and witness this Holy Week and every day of our life.

Project Update: Maintaining God's House - 4/1/20

After over three months of review by Monterey County, we are pleased to report that a building permit should be issued for our project in early April. This milestone is the result of considerable dialog between our architect and the county to address their questions and contain costs. Work continues to match expected project scope and costs to available funds. Unfortunately, due to the coronavirus pandemic and the California state and Monterey county stay-at-home orders, we will not be able to initiate construction until these orders are lifted, even though we will be in possession of a building permit.

Our Capital Campaign continues with 102 pledges and donations totaling \$697,261. We are grateful for all of you who are participating in the campaign.

Domingo de Ramos de la Pasión del Señor


