Pope Francis, in his encyclical The Light of Faith, very beautifully tells us that, "all the truths in which we believe point to the mystery of the new life of faith as a journey of communion with the living God." This Easter reminds us that we are followers of the Way-Jesus-Mary's Son. He who leads us to the Father and the fullness of life. Jesus urges us, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." We are vigorously pursuing a permit fee waiver from the County of Monterey. A more complete update on both the Capital Campaign and the building project was included with last Sunday's bulletin.


