

GOSPEL READINGS FOR THE WEEK

"Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." - Mt. 10:39

Once again, Jesus reminds us that faithful discipleship comes with demands. It's not just a matter of believing. We must truly live our life in Christ. We can't keep the Gospel to ourselves. It must be proclaimed and lived no matter what the cost. Our first reading reminds us, for example, that hospitality is rewarded by God. The woman who receives Elisha into her home is rewarded with a son. Throughout Scripture hospitality is seen as essential in order to be faithful to God. By opening our hearts to others, we open our hearts more fully to God and God's will.

Saint Paul tells us that conformed to Christ in baptism, we die to self and sin and live for and in him. Baptism calls us to a new way of life. We take on the life of Christ, including his cross, and live for others. We welcome and care for God's people, especially the most vulnerable. We begin to see the world with new eyes and with the Heart of Jesus. The cross leads to a new life. Our priorities change. The way we see others changes. As Jesus tells us, "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

Maintaining God's House: Start of Construction

After many years of planning and design effort and nearly six months working with Monterey County we are delighted to announce that our building project is about to begin! This a momentous occasion for the parish and a strong demonstration of our strength as a Catholic community.

On Monday June 15, we obtained our building permit from Monterey County and on the same day signed our agreement with our contractor, Westwood Construction. Therefore we are ready to begin construction, which is scheduled to start Monday, June 29. While construction timelines in a major remodel project like ours can face challenges and be variable, our contract calls for a ten (10) month time to completion. And we all hope this will end up being a month or two shorter. A great goal would be to be complete by Easter 2021!

Special Note: With construction beginning this Monday, June 29, a **Virtual Parish Forum** about our project will take place on **Thursday, July 2 at 7:00 pm.** The forum will last no more than an hour. 


COVID-19 Pruebas Comunitarias:
