GOSPEL READINGS FOR THE WEEK

First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-3; Psalm 145; Second Reading: Romans 8:35, 37-39; Gospel of Matt 13:44-52

"Give them some food yourselves." -- Matthew 14:16

The words *compassion* and *companions* are significant in the gospel and in our life as followers of Christ. Jesus shares in the suffering and passion of those who follow him. They become his companions and he breaks bread with them. The fact that the miracle of the loaves is in all four gospels cannot be taken lightly. It had special importance to the early church. To follow Jesus we are to have compassion and be companions of the poor and hungry. We must share their pain and our bread with them. Pope Francis reminds us that we are to encounter one another and enter deeply into the lives of the poor and suffering, as Jesus did. Empathy is key to following Jesus and bringing about God's reign of love and justice for all.

The Lord tells us in Isaiah 55, "You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; come without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk!" The poor and hungry have a special place in God's heart. Psalm 145 states, "The Lord is good to all and compassionate toward all his works." As companions of Jesus, miracles await us as we live with his compassion!

Solid progress this week. The in-ground plumbing for our new bathrooms is complete and has been inspected by the county. The new ADA compliant church entrance is ready for concrete to be poured Monday, August 3.
