"There am I in the midst of them."—Matthew 18:20

Psalm 95 tells us, "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." We have been created in God's image and likeness to bring about the beloved community. Our readings this Sunday remind us of our responsibility to open our hearts to God's will so to love and care for one another. Paul's life-giving words urge us, "Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law." Paul reminds us that the commandments are summed up in one, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law." This requires constant prayer, as Jesus tells us, so to forgive and heal one another.

The Lord promises us in Matthew's Gospel, "where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." He is present in the Eucharist as we gather in his name. He is present in all of our relationships when we invite him into our lives. He is present in our efforts to heal and transform the world as we live and share his never-ending love.


