"You too go into my vineyard." — Matthew 20:7

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways," says the Lord in this Sunday's reading from Isaiah. Psalm 145, a response to Isaiah's words, proclaims God's goodness, mercy, patience, kindness, compassion, justice, and holiness. Very appropriately, our parable this Sunday of the laborers in the vineyard is a beautiful reminder of God's ways. God's generosity is a totally free gift! God is much more generous and loving than our limited human minds could ever imagine. The needs of the laborers without work and their families is certainly a concern of the landowner and our merciful God. "You too go into my vineyard." God's generous concern for those without work is continuous.

Paul tells us today, "Conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ." Paul urges us to share his closeness to Christ and his mission. To live our faith not thinking as the world does, but as God does with compassion and generosity. Inviting those in need into the vineyard and always remembering, "The last will be first, and the first will be last."






