GOSPEL READINGS FOR THE WEEK

"He emptied himself, taking the form of a slave."—Phil. 2:7

"He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." Paul's description of Jesus, the Son of God, is a powerful reminder of the life that we are called to live as sons and daughters of God. Paul tells us, "Do nothing out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his interests, but also for those of others. Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus." We are to live with Him as humble servants.

Our gospel parable of the two sons asked by their father to work in the vineyard, reminds us of our call to do the will of our Father. Obedience to the Father often requires a change in our priorities and commitments. The chief priests and elders would say, "yes," but they failed to live faithfully before God and God's people. While the tax collectors and the prostitutes changed their ways to follow Christ. With humility may we turn away from our selfishness, like the first son in the gospel, to live and serve the will of our Father as workers in the vineyard of our Lord.


