"You shall love your neighbor as yourself" — Matthew 22:39

The headline this October morning is tragic: "New cases hit three month high as COVID-19 hospitalizations soar." As people of God, we share in the pain of the victims and families affected by the coronavirus. Our Lord speaks to us from Exodus, "If he cries out to me, I will hear him; for I am compassionate." The God of love and mercy hears the cry of the poor and suffering. Jesus in our gospel tells us that the greatest of all commandments—to "love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind,"—requires that "you shall love your neighbor as yourself." To love God means that we love and care for all of God's beloved children. To love our neighbor with compassionate and generous hearts is to love God. Doing so we treat the suffering and most vulnerable as we ourselves want to be treated, with mercy, compassion and justice. With our Loving God, we must hear the cry of the poor today. The "alien...widow or orphan," those without work or healthcare, and all suffering from poverty and violence—and all victims of COVID-19.

This week work to complete the roof connections between the new hall and the church and old hall structures were completed, along with insulation in those areas area. Interior framing of the new bathrooms and interior ramps are also well underway. Next week interior framing work will continue and should be largely completed, and sheet metal work to include new gutters will begin. We will soon be ready for the roofing subcontractor.

This week Jack McAleer, who is coordinating this project, will have a sample brick for us to see after both Masses, as well as order forms in English and Spanish. In this coming year and beyond, we urge leaders and all Catholics to respond in prayer and action to the call to faithful citizenship. In doing so, we live out the call to holiness and work with Christ as he builds his kingdom of love.


