We celebrate the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Our readings might not seem very regal, but speak deeply of what is asked of us as disciples of our Servant King. The final gospel of this Church year proclaims what Martin Luther King called our love for "the Least, the Lost and the Last." We are to search out with love and justice the stranger, the hungry, the sick and the incarcerated. As Pope Francis would say, "to those at the margins of society." To be in solidarity with those who are considered "the Least, the Lost and the Last." The measure of our faithfulness to the Lord is our compassion and service to the most vulnerable and our love and care for them as family—as Jesus himself.

Jesus reigns not in a kingdom of power but of loving service. As God tells us through Ezekiel, "The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal." We are to do the same because our Lord Himself is present in "the Least, the Lost and the Last."
