## Pope Francis proclaims "Year of Saint Joseph"

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart") Pope Francis describes St. Joseph as a beloved, tender, loving, obedient, accepting, creatively



courageous, working father, a father in the shadows. The letter marks the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To celebrate the anniversary, Pope Francis has proclaimed a special "Year of Saint Joseph," which began on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8, 2020 and extend until December 8, 2021.

**Prayer:** 



Incline a merciful ear to our cry, we pray, O Lord, and, casting light on the darkness of our hearts, visit us with the grace of your Son. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Reading: Read John 1:6-8, 19-28 two or three times.

Meditation: After the reading, take time to reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions: What word or words in this passage caught your attention? What in this passage comforted you? What in this passage challenged you?

**Prayer:** Read the Scripture passage one more time. Bring to the Lord the praise, petition, or thanksgiving that the Word inspires in you.

**Contemplation:** Read the Scripture again, followed by this reflection—What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?

"He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him." How do I share my faith with the people around me? What things keep me from sharing my faith?

I am "the voice of one crying out in the desert." When have my efforts to share my faith felt futile? How does God support me when I am discouraged?

#### "There is one among you whom you do not

recognize." When have I encountered Jesus in disguise? When have I failed to recognize Jesus in my life?

#### After a period of silent reflection:

Recite the Lord's prayer and the Psalm for this Sunday, Luke 1:46-50, 53-54

#### Living the Word This Week:

How can I make my life a gift for others in charity?
