In the words of Martin Luther King, "Not everybody can be famous but everybody can be great because greatness is determined by service...

You only need a heart full of grace and a soul generated by love." This Sunday we are reminded of our common call to serve our Loving God. Like young Samuel, we are asked to listen and respond to the voice of God calling out to us. Samuel responds, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening. Similarly, in John's gospel two of John the Baptist's disciples begin to follow Jesus. "What are you looking for?" Jesus asks them. The men respond, "Rabbi, where are you staying?" Jesus invites them, "Come, and you will see." They listen and act. As do Andrew and Simon Peter. Their lives are moved powerfully by their encounter with Jesus. They are simple men, yet they see him as Christ, the Messiah. May we, too, respond to his words, "What are you looking for?" As we open our lives to his Most Sacred Heart, something new takes place within us. Loving and generous service follow. All we need is "a heart full of grace and a soul generated by love!"

This week saw good progress. The exterior of the new hall and church entrance were covered with tar paper, wire, and metal lathe in preparation for stucco. Insulation sprayed inside the roof of the new hall and conference room were completed. We cut-over to our new main water service, finished some exterior electrical work, and received county inspection clearance on electrical, gas, and plumbing. We have a plan to deal with remaining county concerns. We hope to begin additional insulation and drywall work next week. 
