"They abandoned their nets and followed him." —Mark 1:18

The words of Thomas Merton seem especially appropriate as we are reminded by our readings of our call to live with trust and faithfulness before God: "Therefore will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me." In our reading from the book of Jonah, the prophet learns to accept God's will in the midst of his doubts and fears. God works through Jonah. Following the arrest of John the Baptist, Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming, "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." Jesus proclaims a new life. His first disciples have an important role in the fulfillment of the kingdom. Simple and hardworking fishermen, they leave behind their nets, and all else, to follow Jesus. They become fishers of souls. They see in Jesus all that they had ever hoped for.

We, too, are called to this new life. A life of complete trust and faith in God before all else. Let's ask ourselves—What must I leave behind? How can I allow God to work through me? "Teach me your ways, O Lord."

This is our last opportunity to do this framing work given that drywall the installation starts next week. Statement of the U.S. Bishops on the Inauguration

Updates and Changes to COVID-19 Policies

The State of California has updated its travel policy with the following provisions: Non-essential travel should be limited to 120 miles fro the person's home. Californians who travel outside the state or the country must quarantine for 10 days upon their return to California. Visitors to California from other states and countries must also quarantine for 10 days upon their entry into California.

In addition to the State of California policy outlined above, the Diocese of Monterey also has a travel policy. If an employee, priest/deacon, or volunteer travels by plane, train or bus, upon his/her return, he/she must quarantine for 10 days upon his/her return. This change will continue indefinitely until there is a change in numbers.

The CDC has updated its guidance on the wearing of face masks. The masks must be at least a two-ply, washable or surgical mask. Bandanas, gaiters and similar face coverings are no longer acceptable. The mask must cover the nose and mouth.

Those who serve in the parish are asked to please inform Fr. Dennis if you have symptoms of COVID-19 or test positive. Thank you for your support of these policies and procedures for the safety of one another.
