

### GOSPEL READINGS FOR THE WEEK

"He heals the brokenhearted..." —Psalm 147:3

Saint Josephine Bakhita was known for her holiness as a simple servant of "the Master"—her favorite title for God. When asked by a bishop what she does, Bakhita (meaning fortunate), a former slave, responded, "What do I do? Exactly what you are doing—the will of God." We are all called to do the will of God, "who heals the brokenhearted," as Psalm 147 tells us. Our Gospel this Sunday reminds us that Jesus always knew and felt the suffering of others, and responded with his compassionate love. In Mark's Gospel, he is the Divine Healer who never fails to heal the brokenhearted of Galilee. Healing and driving out demons is the will of God. We are told that, "they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons." Through Saint Bakhita and each of us, Jesus recognizes and rejects all evil. He shares the suffering of the brokenhearted and continues to drive out the demons of our day. We can be certain that "the Master" participates in all efforts to end human trafficking and the evils of violence, hatred and racial injustice. May we always follow the will of God. Love.

## Day of Prayer, Awareness and Action Against Human Trafficking - Please Join Us In Prayer

As announced last Sunday in our Masses, we will be recognizing the Day of Prayer, Awareness and Action Against Human Trafficking this **Sunday between our 10:00 am and 12 Noon Masses from 11:15 am to 11:45** am. We hope you can join us for the prayer in honor of the victims of human trafficking, who not only suffer from the violence of modern-day slavery, but are also among the most vulnerable victims of COVID-19.

The patron Saint of victims of victims of slavery and human trafficking—modern day slavery—is **Saint**Josephine Bakhita. Bakhita was born in southern

Sudan in 1869. When she was nine she was kidnapped and sold into slavery. Sold from one master to another over a period of years, she was finally sold to an Italian family who brought her back to Italy. She was later sent to a boarding school of the Daughters of Charity and heard the Gospel for the first time. When later set free, Bakhita heard a voice urging her to consecrate herself to God. She dedicated her life to God as a Daughter of Charity. Saint Josephine Bakhita was known for caring for the poor and suffering. She died on February 8, 1947 and was canonized a Saint in 2000. Saint Bakhita, pray for us and for all efforts to end human trafficking.

### Let Us Pray

Oh God, we didn't see them.

The hundreds and thousands of human beings

Trafficked each year to join the millions who are trapped in modern day slavery.

Under terrible conditions, they work in factories, plow fields, harvest crops, work quarries, fill brothels, clean homes, and haul water.

Many are children with tiny fingers for weaving rugs and small shoulders for bearing rifles.

Their labor is forced, their bodies beaten, their faces hidden from those who don't really want to see them.

But you see them all, God of the poor. You hear their cry and you answer by opening our eyes, and breaking our hearts and loosening our tongues to insist:

No mas. No more.


