# "Whoever lives the truth comes to the light."—John 3:21

In his letter to the Ephesians, Paul tells us very beautifully, "God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ." God is always eager to rescue us from sin. As John tells us in the Gospel, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." We are God's beloved "handiwork." Each of us is loved by God. Our readings this Fourth Sunday of Lent call out to us to live in the light of faith and follow Jesus. Only by actively living our faith and following Jesus are we given a share in his death and resurrection.

Nicodemus, the Pharisee, met with the Lord in the darkness of the night. We can imagine him listening carefully to Jesus' every word. The image of light and darkness that John uses, and that appear so often in Scripture, speak to Nicodemus and each of us. "Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God." What would it mean for you to walk in the light this Lent and always?

# We Remember St. Patrick and St. Joseph

The Feast Days of St. Patrick on Wednesday and St. Joseph on Friday, March 19, will be celebrated this week with 12 Noon Masses.



Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter last December, titled "Patris corde" (With a Father's Heart), Francis proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" that will continue until December 8, 2021. The Holy Father said, "The aim of this Apostolic Letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and zeal."

In Pope Francis' words, "Each of us can discover in Joseph—the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet, and hidden presence—an intercessor, a support, and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all."
