Lent calls us to a life of humility before God. God's covenant of love turns us away from the pain of sin to walk in the ways of the Lord with "prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears."

Jesus tells us as he prepares for his death that we must die to ourselves to glorify God. "Whoever serves me must follow me, and wherever I am, there also will my servant be." Like a grain of wheat, may our faithfulness to God bring each of us new life during these holy days of healing, promise and peace. We forever trust in the voice of the Father speaking to us during these blessed days: "I have glorified it and will glorify it again."
