Great news, the two restrooms off of the church are now operational and our outdoor toilet has been removed. Please enjoy these new, clean restrooms. This week we also completed plumbing and accessory work in all restrooms, and have made considerable plumbing progress in the kitchen. Vinyl flooring and baseboard moldings are also finished. We made modest progress on HVAC this week, but that subcontractor remains problematic and behind schedule. We are looking at a mid-May project completion.

Important Update on Orange Tier Assignment

We received this week an email from the Diocese in light of the County of Monterey moving to the Orange Tier. Governor Newsom announced that the state will fully reopen by June 15, as long as there is enough vaccine supply so that everyone 16 and older will be able to be vaccinated and the hospitalization rates remain stable.

At this point, churches within the county will be able to increase occupancy to 50% of the building's seating capacity. The face mask, social distancing, health check and cleaning protocols will still remain the same. Parishes also have the option of continuing outdoor Masses, as well as the celebration of other sacraments outdoors, if the outside location has a greater capacity than the church building, which is our case at OLMC. For now, we will continue celebrating Masses in our outdoor chapel. We will consider in the future, as appropriate, other options to best meet the needs of our parish.
