First Reading: Ezekiel 17:22-24; Psalm 92; Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10; Gospel of Mark 4:26-34 *"This is how it is with the kingdom of God."*—Mark 4:26

Jesus is truly an amazing and imaginative storyteller! His parables are very special reminders of the gift and power of the kingdom of God that dwells within and among us. This Sunday we receive two parables that call out to us to listen and hear the voice of God. As followers of Christ, we are asked to bring about the fullness of God's reign here on earth. Jesus urges us to allow the parables to speak to us personally. The first parable is about the seed and the soil. As faithful followers of Christ, we are urged to allow the seed—the word of God—and the good earth—our receptive human hearts—to transform and guide us. Poet Paul Murray, in his poem *Know Yourself* (see below) reminds us of the possibilities that dwell within us as children of God and followers of Christ. Like the very tiny mustard seed with amazing potential, God's intimate love for us makes all things possible! "We walk by faith, not by sight," Saint Paul tells us. We may seem

simple and ordinary, but the power of our faith and God's transforming love gives us the grace to build God's kingdom and change our lives and world!
