In this controversy story the hypocritical Pharisees and scribes who oppose Jesus serve as negative models for what it means to follow the true way and will of God in order to worship God authentically. Their hypocrisy warns us that our cherished religious traditions and customs, which are merely human precepts, can nullify the very word of God they are meant to supplement and support, if they serve our own selfish aims rather than God's plan. But by powerfully reaffirming God's word over human tradition, Jesus invites us to allow the original, genuine and clear word of God to purify the excesses that our various religious, social and cultural human traditions, customs and practices have introduced into our

Saint of the week: August 30
Saint Jeanne Jugan

1792-1879 Born in Brittany, in France, Jeanne was four when her fisherman father died. Her mother supported six children as a farm laborer. Jeanne became a kitchen maid at 16, and her mistress took her on visits to the sick and poor. She joined a third order at 25, working in a hospital for six years, then returned to domestic service.

Soon, however, she began devoting herself entirely to care of the poor, especially widows, living in community with two other women. Though she established the Little Sisters of the Poor in 1842, she was not recognized as the order's founder until 1893. Canonized in 2009, she is considered a patron of the elderly. www.catholiccurrent.org



Santa de la semana: Agosto 30
Santa Juana Jugan

(1792-1879) Juana nació en Bretaña, Francia. Ella tenía cuatro años cuando su padre falleció. Su madre mantuvo a sus seis hijos como trabajadora agrícola. A los 16 años, Juana trabajaba como sirvienta en una cocina y su patrona la llevaba con ella cuando visitaba a los pobres y los enfermos. A los 25 años, se incorporó a una Tercera Orden y trabajó seis años en un hospital, pero luego regresó al

servicio doméstico. Sin embargo, muy pronto, empezó a dedicarse completamente al cuidado de los pobres, especialmente de las viudas, viviendo en una comunidad con otras dos mujeres. Aunque ella estableció la orden de las Hermanitas de los Pobres en 1842, no fue reconocida como su fundadora hasta 1893. Juana fue canonizada en el 2009, y es considerada como una patrona de los ancianos. www.catholiccurrent.org

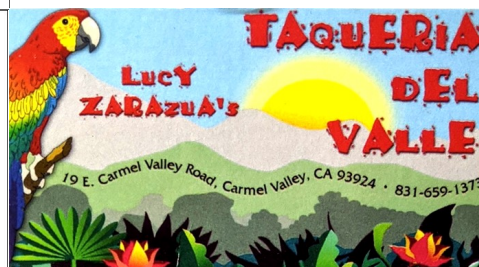
