Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 23-24, 2021

1st Reading: Jer 31:7-9; Psalm 126; 2nd Reading: Heb 5: 1-6; Gospel Mk 10:46-52

"I want to see"



This episode of the blind beggar of Jericho is among the liveliest pages of Mark, the only Evangelist to provide us with the man's name, indicating that he was, perhaps, known among the first generations of Church. This account underscores the importance that Jesus attributed to the faith of those who came to him to be healed of their infirmities. While others sought to silence Bartimaeus, his cries of supplication reached Jesus who called him. This is the sole instance wherein Mark refers the title, "Son of David," to Jesus, but, beginning with II Samuel 7,12, quite a few texts present the Messiah as a descendent of David (cf. Psalm 89). In the Greek text, the blind man also calls him, "Rabbuni," which is properly translated as "my Master." Immediately following the healing, the Greek

verb chosen by Mark to narrate Bartimaeus' final reaction can indicate the action of following in a physical or in a spiritual sense as is the case with the other disciples. While, initially, it may appear difficult to determine the import, it seems to imply both forms of pursuit as Mark adjoins that this accompanying was "on the way," i.e., the route to Jerusalem with all that the journey implies. Therefore, we can discern the beginning of a spiritual discipleship as the healed man's enthusiasm and the Evangelist's emphasis on this cure would lead us to believe. 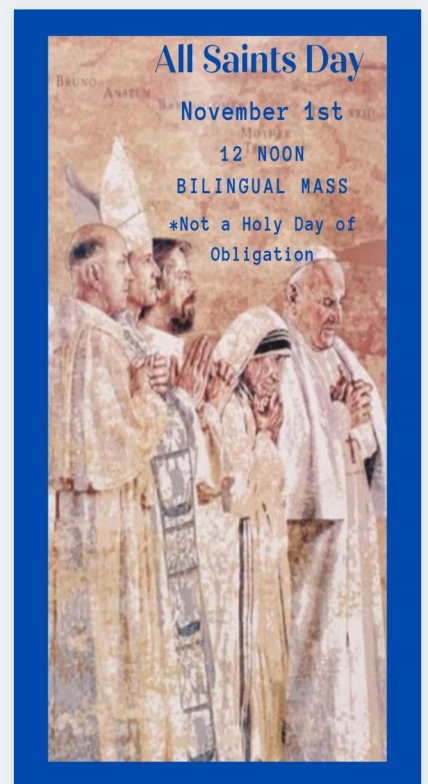

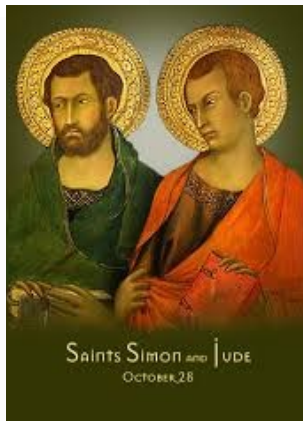

Saint of the week: October 28 Sts. Simon & Jude, Apostles

Listed among the Twelve Apostles in the New Testament, Simon is “the Canaanite” to Matthew and Mark and “the Zealot” to Luke; Jude is “Thaddeus” to Matthew and Mark, “Judas of James” to Luke, and “Judas, not Iscariot” to John. After Pentecost, they disappear. However, according to Eastern tradition, Simon died peacefully in Edessa, while Western tradition has him evangelizing in Egypt, then teaming up with Jude, who had been in Mesopotamia, on a mission to Persia, where they were martyred on the same day. Simon is the patron saint of tanners and lumberjacks; Jude is the patron of desperate causes, possibly because early Christians would pray to him, with a name evoking Judas Iscariot, only when all else failed. Santos de la semana: Octubre 28 Santos Simón & Judas, Apóstoles

Nombrados entre los Doce Apóstoles en el Nuevo Testamento, Simón es “el cananeo” para Mateo y Marcos y “el zelote” para Lucas; Judas es “Tadeo” para Mateo y Marcos, “Judas de Santiago” para Lucas y “Judas, no el Iscariote” para Juan. Después de Pentecostés, ellos desaparecieron. Sin embargo, según cuenta la tradición oriental, Simón falleció pacíficamente en Edesa, mientras que la tradición occidental cuenta que él evangelizaba en Egipto y que luego se unió a Judas—quien había estado en Mesopotamia—para ir juntos en una misión a Persia en donde ambos fueron martirizados en un mismo día. Simón es el santo patrón de los curtidores y de los leñadores; Judas es el patrón de las causas desesperadas posiblemente porque los primeros cristianos le rezaban, con un nombre que evocaba a Judas Iscariote, solo cuando todo lo demás fallaba. gritos de súplica llegaron a Jesús que lo llamó. Este es el único caso en el que Marcos se refiere al título, “Hijo de David”, a Jesús, pero, comenzando con II Samuel 7,12, bastantes textos presentan al Mesías como un descendiente de David (cf. Salmo 89). En el texto griego, el ciego también lo llama “Rabbuni”, que se traduce correctamente como “mi Maestro”. Inmediatamente después de la curación, el verbo griego elegido por Marcos para narrar la reacción final de Bartimeo puede indicar la acción de seguir en un sentido físico o espiritual como es el caso de los otros discípulos. Si bien, inicialmente, puede parecer difícil determinar la importancia, parece implicar ambas formas de búsqueda, ya que Marcos adjunta que este acompañamiento estaba “en camino”, es decir, la ruta a Jerusalén con todo lo que implica el viaje. Por lo tanto, podemos discernir el comienzo de un discipulado espiritual como nos llevaría a creer el entusiasmo del hombre sanado y el énfasis del evangelista en esta curación. Así, Jesús no solo ilumina los ojos del hombre, sino que también ilumina el camino para seguirlo.

Este episodio del ciego de Jericó se encuentra entre las páginas más animadas del evangelio de Marcos, el único evangelista que nos proporcionó el nombre del hombre, lo que indica que fue, quizás, conocido entre las primeras generaciones de la Iglesia. Este relato subraya la importancia que Jesús atribuía a la fe de quienes acudían a él para ser sanados de sus dolencias. Mientras otros buscaban silenciar a Bartimeo, sus

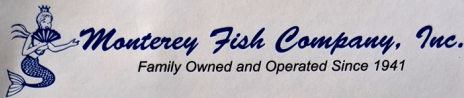
