Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time November 13-14, 2021

1st Reading: Dn 12: 1-3 Psalm 16; 2nd Reading: Heb 10: 11-14, 18 Gospel Mk 13:24-32

"The wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament"



When reading chapters 7-12 of Daniel it is important to remember that it is "apocalyptic literature," a literary genre that makes use of visions, symbols and seers to disclose a reality. It is related to prophetic literature in that it is concerned with conveying a message to a particular historical community via an intermediary. This intermediary or messenger then "discloses" God's hidden plan to the intended audience. Apocalyptic literature is associated with periods of crisis or persecution, as is the case with today's text. The material in Daniel 7-12 is identified with the persecution of the Jews during the Maccabean period, roughly, around 165 B.C. It would seem, then, that the "message" in today's first reading was intended for those Jews who were experiencing persecution

during this most complex period in Jewish history. Today's brief reading is part of a larger section of Daniel, chapters 10-12, that functions as one visionary experience. In today's verses, Michael, who, in chapter 10, had already battled the Persian and Greek forces, reappears as the "guardian" the Jewish people. The text goes on to express a new shift in Jewish thought, since prior to this time there does not seem to have been any belief in an afterlife within Jewish theology. Earlier belief held that God's reward or punishment was experienced on earth, both in the present and in subsequent generations. Here we find the first explicit reference made to resurrection and an afterlife (allusions to it may be identified in Isaiah 26:19 and Ezekiel 37). By Maribeth Howell, OP© , OCP.

World Day of the Poor

In 2017, Pope Francis suggested the Catholic Church set aside one day each year when communities can "reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel." He designated this day as the World Day of the Poor, and it will be celebrated on the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time each year.

WHO LIVES IN POVERTY USA? All those who make less than the Federal government's official poverty threshold... which for a family of four is about \$25,700. People working at minimum wage, even holding down multiple jobs. Seniors living on fixed incomes. Wage earners suddenly out of work. Millions of families everywhere from our cities to rural communities. Poverty does not strike all demographics equally. For example, in 2018, 10.6% of men, and 12.9% of women lived in Poverty USA. Along the same lines, the poverty rate for married



couples in 2018 was only 4.7% - but the poverty rate for single-parent families with no wife present was 12.7%, and for single-parent families with no husband present was 24.9%. In 2018, the poverty rate for people living with a disability was 25.7%. That's nearly 4 million people living with a disability—in poverty. Saint of the week: November 17th St. Elizabeth of Hungary

Elizabeth's short life was nonetheless full; she had a happy marriage and children, was a secular Franciscan, and was so devoted to the poor and sick that she gave away royal robes and founded hospitals. The daughter of a Hungarian king, Elizabeth married a nobleman of Thuringia, Louis, at age 14. He complained about the expense of her many charities until he witnessed a miracle involving Elizabeth, bread and roses. After he died during a Crusade, she became a Third Order Franciscan at Marburg, Germany, where she founded a hospital to care for the sick. Elizabeth, who was declared a saint in 1235, is the patron of bakers, young brides, widows, those falsely accused, countesses and secular Franciscans. © 2021, United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. La vida de Isabel fue corta, sin embargo, fue una vida plena. Ella tuvo un matrimonio feliz y tuvo hijos, fue una franciscana seglar y era tan dedicada a los pobres y a los enfermos que regaló unas túnicas reales y fundó hospitales. Ella fue hija de un rey húngaro y, a los 14 años, se casó con Luis, un hombre noble de Turingia. Él se quejaba del gasto que ocasionaban sus múltiples caridades hasta que él fue testigo de un milagro que involucró a Isabel, a pan y a rosas. Después del fallecimiento de Luis en una de las Cruzadas, ella se convirtió en franciscana de la Tercera Orden en Marburg, Alemania, en donde fundó un hospital para cuidar a los enfermos. Isabel, quien fue declarada santa en 1235, es la patrona de los panaderos, las novias jóvenes, las viudas, los acusados falsamente y los franciscanos seglares. XXXIII Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

1era. Lectura: Dn 12, 1-3; Salmo: 15; 2da. Lectura: Heb 10, 11-14. 18; Evangelio: Mc 13, 24-32

Los sabios brillarán como el esplendor del firmamento

del texto actual. El material de Daniel 7-12 se identifica con la persecución de los judíos durante el período macabeo, aproximadamente, alrededor del 165 a. C. Parecería, entonces, que el "mensaje" en la primera lectura de hoy estaba destinado a aquellos judíos que estaban experimentando persecución durante este período tan complejo en la historia judía. La breve lectura de hoy es parte de una sección más amplia de Daniel, capítulos 10-12, que funciona como una experiencia visionaria. En los versos de hoy, Miguel, quien, en el capítulo 10, ya había luchado contra las fuerzas persas y griegas, reaparece como el "guardián" del pueblo judío. El texto continúa expresando un nuevo cambio en el pensamiento judío, ya que antes de este tiempo no parece haber existido ninguna creencia en una vida futura dentro de la teología judía. La creencia anterior sostenía que la recompensa o el castigo de Dios se experimentaba en la tierra, tanto en el presente como en las generaciones posteriores. Aquí encontramos la primera referencia explícita que se hace a la resurrección y una vida después de la muerte (las alusiones a ella se pueden identificar en Isaías 26:19 y Ezequiel 37). Al leer los capítulos 7-12 de Daniel, es importante recordar que se trata de "literatura apocalíptica", un género literario que hace uso de visiones, símbolos y videntes para revelar una realidad. Se relaciona con la literatura profética en el sentido de que se ocupa de transmitir un mensaje a una comunidad histórica particular a través de un intermediario. Este intermediario o mensajero luego "revela" el plan oculto de Dios a la audiencia prevista. La literatura apocalíptica se asocia a períodos de crisis o persecución, como es el caso

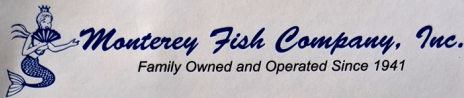

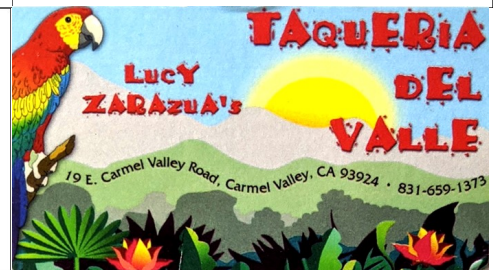
