
John the Baptist directs the people's "expectation" for a Messiah away from himself and toward a mightier one to come. John baptizes with water, a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Luke 3:3), but the one to come will baptize with God's "Holy Spirit and fire." John is not even worthy to perform the slave's task of loosening the thongs of the sandals of this mightier one to come. After Jesus had been baptized together with all the people to indicate his solidarity with their sinful condition, God proclaims him as his beloved Son, equipping him with the Holy Spirit to be the mightier one to come who will baptize with the "Holy Spirit and fire." God's declaration of Jesus as "my beloved Son" combines two lines of Jewish tradition. First, "Son of God," originally referring to the people of Israel (Exod 4:22; Jer 3:19; 31:9, 20; Hos 11:1), came to designate the long awaited Davidic messiah-king who would save his people (2 Sam 7:14; Pss 2:7; 89:4, 26-27). Second, the identification of Jesus as the Spirit-equipped agent of God shows strong allusions to the chosen "Servant of God" in Isaiah 42:1. God has appointed Jesus as his "beloved Son" in the sense of his Spirit-equipped "Servant" sent to his people to initiate a new and decisive situation of salvation. . Deacon Owen Comnings 2003 OCP.

The Sacrament of Baptism in the Catechism of the Catholic Church and in our Parish Community.

Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit (vitae spiritualis ianua), and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons and daughters of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word.

This sacrament is called Baptism, after the central rite by which it is carried out: to baptize (Greek baptizein) means to "plunge" or "immerse"; the "plunge" into the water symbolizes the catechumen's burial into Christ's death, from which he rises up by resurrection with him, as "a new creature

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated in our Parish at the request of families, we have baptisms on Saturdays at noon at the end of this month we are going to have two infant baptisms and we three young ladies preparing to receive this sacrament on the Easter Vigil next year 2023.



Saint of the week: Jan. 12th

St. Marguerite Bourgeoys

(1620-1700) Growing up in Troyes, France, Marguerite formed a special relationship with Our Lady. She was turned away by two religious communities, but met the founder of Montreal, Canada, when he returned to France to visit his sister. He invited Marguerite to open a school in the New World; she went, despite misgivings, after praying to Mary. From that first school in an abandoned stable, her ministry grew to include teaching women crafts and founding the Sisters of the Congregation of Notre Dame. She managed to keep her sisters uncloistered, despite opposition from the bishop, and served as superior for many years. Santa Margarita Bourgeoys

(M1620-1700) Margarita creció en Troyes, Francia, formando una relación especial con Nuestra Señora. Ella fue rechazada por dos comunidades religiosas pero luego, cuando regresó a Francia para visitar a su hermana, conoció al fundador de Montreal, Canadá. Él la invitó a abrir una escuela en el Nuevo Mundo; a pesar de sus dudas, y luego de rezarle a María, ella aceptó. Desde aquella primera escuela en un establo abandonado, su ministerio creció incluyendo la enseñanza de artesanía a mujeres y fundando las

Hermanas de la Congregación de Notre Dame. A pesar de la oposición del obispo, ella logró mantener a las religiosas sin tener que estar enclustradas y, por muchos años, prestó servicios como superiora. El Bautismo del Señor

1era. Lectura: Is 42, 1-4. 6-7; Salmo: 28; 2da. Lectura: Hch 10, 34-38

El los bautizara con el Espíritu Santo y con fuego.

Juan el Bautista dirige la "expectativa" de la gente para un Mesías lejos de sí mismo y hacia uno más poderoso para venirse. Juan bautiza con agua, un bautismo de arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados (Lucas 3:3), pero el que vendrá bautizará con el "Espíritu Santo y fuego" de Dios. Juan no es incluso digno de

realizar la tarea del esclavo de aflojar el tangas de las sandalias de este más poderoso por venir. Después de que Jesús había sido bautizado junto con todo el pueblo para indicar su solidaridad con su condición pecaminosa, Dios lo proclama como su Hijo amado, equipándolo con el Espíritu Santo para ser el más poderoso por venir que bautizará con el "Espíritu Santo y fuego". La declaración de Dios de Jesús como "mi hijo amado" combina dos líneas de tradición judía. Primero, "Hijo de Dios", originalmente refiriéndose al pueblo de Israel (Éxodo 4:22; Jér 3:19; 31:9, 20; Os 11:1), llegó a designar al tan esperado mesías-rey davídico que salvaría a su pueblo (2 Sam 7:14; Salmos 2:7; 89:4, 26-27). Segundo, la identificación de Jesús como el Espíritu equipado Agente de Dios muestra fuertes alusiones al "Siervo de Dios" escogido en Isaías 42:1. Dios ha designado a Jesús como su "Hijo amado" en el sentido de su "Siervo" equipado con el Espíritu enviado a su pueblo para iniciar una nueva y decisiva situación de salvación.


