Annual Celebration of World Day of Prayer for Consecrated life on February 2

The Catholic Church will hold its annual celebration of World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life on February 2, and parishes will commemorate the event over the weekend of February 5-6. This event is a special time for individual parishes to celebrate the gift of consecrated life and pray for men and women discerning a consecrated vocation with the global Catholic Church.

Instituted by Saint John Paul II in 1997, World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life is celebrated in conjunction with the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas Day, which commemorates through the blessing and lighting of candles that Christ is the light of the world. So too, those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples.

Bishop James F. Checchio of Metuchen, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations spoke of how the example of consecrated men and women should spur all of the faithful on to greater holiness. "With lives of poverty, chastity, and obedience, consecrated men and women provide us with an example of complete dedication to Christ. They remind us that regardless of the vocation the Lord calls us to, we are all called to union with Christ and to do our part to build up the Kingdom of God."

**Saint of the week: Jan. 31st
St. John Bosco**

(1815-1888) Born to a poor family in Italy, this patron saint of editors and laborers is considered one of the great social saints. Ordained a priest in 1841, he was sent to study theology in Turin, where he became a magnet for neglected youths during a turbulent period of rapid industrialization and revolutionary politics. Don Bosco, who once hoped to become a foreign missionary, founded the Salesians in 1854. The order sheltered more than 800 orphan boys, then opened workshops for shoemakers, tailors, bookbinders and other trades. Don Bosco was also a prolific writer, and co-founded a women's congregation to work among girls. When he died, more than 40,000 people in Turin filed past his coffin to show their love and respect. **Santo de la semana: Enero 31
San Juan Bosco**

(1815-1888) Juan, nació en el seno de una familia pobre en Italia, es el santo patrón de los escritores y de los obreros y es considerado uno de los grandes santos sociales. En 1841, fue ordenado sacerdote y enviado a estudiar teología en Torino, en donde mucha de la juventud ignorada se sintió atraída a él durante el turbulento y rápido período de la industrialización y de las políticas revolucionarias. Don Bosco, quien alguna vez quiso ser misionero en el extranjero, fundó la orden de los Salesianos en 1854. La orden acogió a más de 800 niños huérfanos y, más adelante, estableció talleres para zapateros, sastres, encuadernadores y otros oficios. Don Bosco también fue un escritor prolífico y fue cofundador de una congregación femenina para que trabajaran con las niñas. Cuando falleció, más de 40,000 personas en Torino le dieron su último adiós a su paso por el ataúd, demostrando su amor y respeto

Todo lo que hacemos no tiene sentido y no sirve a menos que se haga con amor. El amor es entonces el mayor don espiritual.

Hagan todo con amor cristiano por unos y otros. 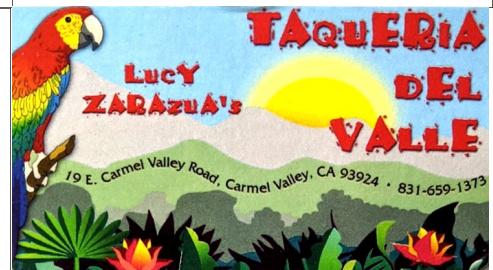
