## The Beatitudes

The presence of a huge and distinguished audience--the Twelve, a great crowd of disciples, and a large number of people from near and far--sets the scene for Jesus' solemn utterance of his "sermon on the plain" in Luke's gospel. The first three beatitudes of this sermon exhort the followers of Jesus to accept present poverty, hunger, and sorrow for the sake of experiencing the kingdom of God now and receiving satisfaction and joy from God in the future. The fourth beatitude encourages us to endure with joy, and like the true prophets of old, the hatred, insults, and rejection we may undergo in living our lives in accord with Jesus' teachings. Such

endurance blesses us now and gives us hope for a great reward in heaven. The exhortations of these four positive beatitudes are reinforced by four corresponding woes. Those who are rich, satisfied, and laughing now must beware that they have already received their consolation and will have their good fortunes reversed by God in the future. These things bring present reward but hold no hope for a future reward in heaven. If people are speaking well of us, are we living and bearing witness to the gospel of Jesus, especially the gospel of life, or being treated like the ancestors treated the false prophets of old? The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of listening and dialogue beginning with a solemn opening in Rome on October 9 and 10, 2021 with each individual diocese and church celebrating the following week on October 17. The synodal process will conclude in 2023.

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium." This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission.

The Synod process has begun in our dioceses with a facilitator training, then to the parish level, we will update you with more information .

**Saint of the week: Feb. 14th  
St. Valentine**

How February 14 came to be celebrated as the feast for lovers is somewhat a mystery. What little is known of the feast's namesake can be attributed to the lives of two martyrs: one a priest, the other a bishop. Their lives bear little resemblance to the contemporary holiday. The priest Valentine reportedly was beheaded in 269 by Emperor Claudius II. The bishop, known for healing, was martyred earlier. It's probable that a medieval custom of sending messages of love on this day merged later with the feast. United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Washington, DC.

(Aun es un misterio cómo es que el 14 de febrero se celebra como la fiesta de los enamorados. Lo poco que se sabe del homónimo de la fiesta puede ser atribuido a la vida de dos mártires: uno fue un sacerdote y, el otro, un obispo.
