1st Reading: Sir 27: 4-7 Psalm 92; 2nd Reading: 1 Cor 15: 54-58 Gospel: Lk 6: 39-45

“For every tree is known by its fruit”



In the Gospel from Saint Luke, it is clear that Jesus is fulfilling the role of the rabbi, the teacher, having received the Law and the Prophets, he hands them on in a form specific to the people of his time. Here he is dispensing advice to people who were looking to live out the law. Like the first reading he follows the rabbinic tradition of using examples from nature to show that God's law is consistent across creation. It is quite likely that Jesus had the first reading from the book of Sirach on his mind as he spoke. This passage is an amazing commentary on our public selves. The author calls us to live authentic lives, to let what is inside be consistent with what we say

and do. What I find especially fascinating is that both Jesus and Sirach suggest that we are not as good as we think we are at being fake people. People will know what is in our hearts by looking at our words and deeds. Saint Paul, for his part, steeped in the Pharisaic tradition, also reflects on the way in which we live our lives, but he starts from a different perspective. He believes that since we have been robed with immortality, since we have already been given salvation in Christ, that reality needs to be lived out in our lives. Death has no more power. Sin should not even tempt us, for we have been saved. Putting all of this together, it means that we should be living audacious lives with a radical honesty. OCP 2004

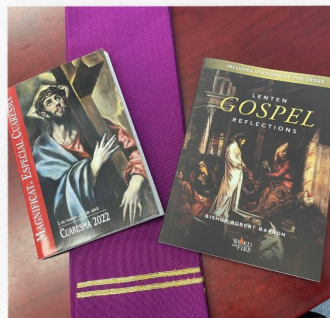

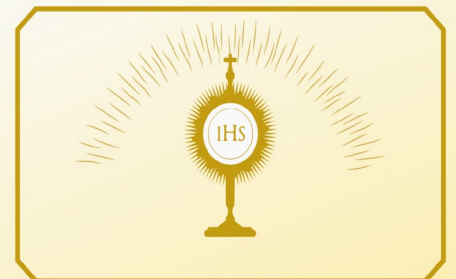

**Saint of the week: March. 3rd
St. Katharine Drexel**

(1858-1955) (The daughter of a wealthy Philadelphia banker, Katharine received marriage proposals but wanted to become a contemplative nun. After inheriting a fortune, she visited the Dakotas and witnessed American Indians' poverty, subsequently pleading with Pope Leo XIII to send them more missionaries. But he and others encouraged her to found a congregation to work among people of color. In 1891, she and thirteen companions became the first Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. For more than forty years, she led the order, using her fortune to establish numerous missions and schools for Native Americans and African Americans. Following a heart attack in 1935, which limited her missionary travel, she retired to a life of prayer. Canonized in 2000, she is the patron of home missions. **Santa de la semana: Marzo 3
Santa Catalina Drexel**

(1858-1955) Catalina, hija de un acaudalado banquero de Filadelfia, tuvo propuestas matrimoniales, pero ella deseó ser monja contemplativa. Luego de heredar una fortuna, ella visitó Dakota del norte y del sur y fue testigo de la pobreza en la que vivían los nativo-americanos; por eso, le escribió al papa León XIII para que les enviaran más misioneros. Pero, tanto él como otros, le animaron a fundar una congregación para trabajar con personas de color. En 1891, ella y trece compañeras se convirtieron en las primeras Hermanas del Santísimo Sacramento. Por más de cuarenta años, ella dirigió la orden utilizando su fortuna para establecer numerosas misiones y escuelas para nativo-americanos y afro-americanos. En 1935, luego de sufrir un ataque al corazón que limitó sus viajes a las misiones, ella se retiró para vivir una vida de oración. Catalina fue canonizada en el año 2000 y es patrona de las misiones nacionales

1era. Lectura: Sir 27, 5-8 **Salmo:** 91;

2da. Lectura: 1 Cor 15, 54-58 **Evangelio:** Lk 6, 39-45

“Cada árbol se conoce por sus frutos”

En el Evangelio de San Lucas, es claro que Jesús está cumpliendo el papel de rabino (maestro) habiendo recibido la Ley y los Profetas, los transmite en una forma específica a la gente de su tiempo. Aquí está dando consejos a las personas que buscaban vivir de acuerdo a la ley. Al igual que la primera lectura, sigue la tradición rabínica de usar ejemplos de la naturaleza para mostrar que la ley de Dios es consistente en toda la creación. Es muy probable que Jesús tuviera en mente la primera lectura del libro de Eclesiástico mientras hablaba. Este pasaje es un comentario asombroso sobre nuestro yo público. El autor nos llama a vivir vidas auténticas, a dejar que lo que hay dentro sea coherente con lo que decimos y hacemos. Lo que encuentro especialmente fascinante es que tanto Jesús como Sirach sugieren que no somos tan buenos como creemos ser. La gente sabrá lo que hay en nuestros corazones al mirar nuestras palabras y hechos. San Pablo, por su parte, empapado de la tradición farisaica, también reflexiona sobre la forma en que vivimos nuestra vida, pero parte de una perspectiva diferente. Él cree que puesto que hemos sido revestidos de inmortalidad, puesto que ya se nos ha dado la salvación en Cristo, esa realidad debe ser vivida en nuestras vidas. La muerte ya no tiene poder. El pecado ni siquiera debe tentarnos, porque hemos sido salvados. Poniendo todo esto junto, significa que deberíamos vivir vidas audaces con una honestidad radical.

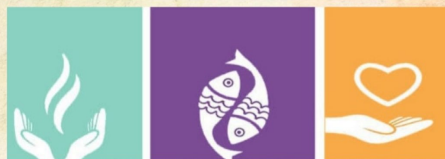

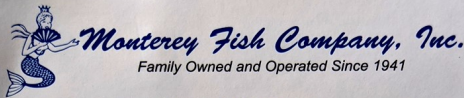

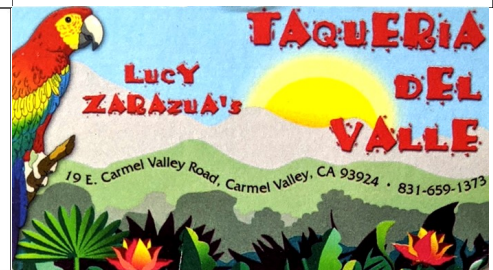
