This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.

Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all.

Celebrate Eucharist—The Feast of Corpus Christi

Every Mass is a commemoration of Jesus' Last Supper and a proclamation and participation on this mystery. Because we can sometimes get lost in the routine each Sunday, the feast of Corpus Christi helps us focus once again on what we are called to do at Mass.

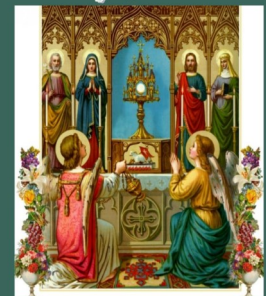
Parishes celebrate the feast day in a variety of ways but regardless of the activity, its purpose is the same:

- To remember the night on which Christ celebrated his Last Supper, and during which he shared his own Body and Blood with his friends
- To proclaim and participate in the Eucharist as a mystery at the heart of the Catholic faith, as the source and summit of our lives as disciples of Christ
- The Feast of Corpus Christi reminds us that at every Mass, we are called to:
 - CELEBRATE what we believe. We express our faith in the risen Christ, who gave his life for us out of love.
 - LIVE what we believe. We give witness to the risen Christ by our way of life.
 - BECOME what we receive. We become Christlike, so that others might see in us and in what we do the one who gave his life for us.

St. Romuald**



For many years he lived alone as a hermit. He fasted and prayed. When he was quite old, he desired to be a martyr. He decided to travel to Hungary, where he hoped to be killed for his faith. On the journey he discovered that he was too old to continue, so he returned to Italy, where he again led a hermit's life. His way of living was so strict that at first few people were strong enough to imitate him. But he did start several groups of hermits. He died in 1027, at about 75 years old. He is the founder of the Camaldolese Order

Su forma de vivir era tan estricta que al principio pocas personas tenían la fuerza suficiente para imitarlo. Pero él comenzó varios grupos de ermitaños. Murió en 1027, a los 75 años. El es el fundador de la Orden de los Camandulenses.

Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad

1era. Lectura: Prov 8, 22-31 **Salmo:** 8; **2da.Lectura:** Rom 5, 1-5 **Evangelio:** Jn 16, 12-15

“Gloria al Padre y al Hijo y al Espíritu Santo. Al Dios que es, que era y que vendrá”

Esta semana volvemos al Tiempo Liturgico Ordinario. Este domingo y el próximo domingo, sin embargo, están designados como solemnidades, días especiales que llaman nuestra atención sobre misterios centrales de nuestra fe. Hoy, primer domingo después de Pentecostés, celebramos la Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad. Esta fiesta nos invita a considerar lo que creemos acerca de Dios, quien se nos ha revelado en la Trinidad, un Dios en tres personas.

Los versículos del Evangelio de hoy llegan casi al final del largo discurso de Jesús en la Última Cena. En la primera parte de este discurso, como vimos la semana pasada en Pentecostés, Jesús ofrece promesas a los discípulos. Aunque debe dejar a los discípulos, les dice que tendrán un futuro por la ayuda que les enviará en el Espíritu Santo. En esta sección, él se enfoca más en la forma del futuro, que incluirá la victoria de Jesús sobre el mundo que ellos compartirán. Los discípulos de Jesús no pueden conocer el futuro. Solo pueden saber que, sea cual sea la forma que adopte el futuro, no tendrán que afrontarlo solos. Tienen al Espíritu de la Verdad, que seguirá impartiendo la enseñanza de Jesús.

Leer este pasaje en este Domingo de la Trinidad refuerza nuestra comprensión de la unidad compartida por los miembros de la Trinidad. Aunque la idea de un Dios en tres personas sigue siendo un misterio, tenemos la seguridad de que así como Jesús y el Padre lo comparten todo, Jesús y el Espíritu lo comparten todo también.
