"What Is Expected"



In today's Gospel we hear Jesus teach about faith and service to God. The context is a continuing dialogue between Jesus and his followers about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Jesus has just finished an instruction on sin and forgiveness. There are two related teachings that Jesus offers to his disciples when they cry out for an increase in faith. The first is the familiar reminder that faith, even just a little, will enable the followers of Jesus to do wondrous things. But this uplifting and inspiring teaching is quickly followed by the second teaching, a caution about knowing one's place in God's plans. The disciples of Jesus are to understand themselves as servants to God and his plans. Even when God works wonders

through us, with our mustard seed-sized faith, we must not seek praise. Our participation in God's plans is God's grace to us—nothing more, nothing less. **Saint of the week: October 2nd
The Holy Guardian Angels**



The concept of an angel assigned to guide and nurture each human being is a development of Catholic doctrine and piety based on Scripture but not directly drawn from it. Jesus' words in Matthew 18:10 best support the belief: "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father"

Devotion to the angels began to develop with the birth of the monastic tradition. Saint Benedict (July 11) gave it impetus and Saint Bernard of Clairvaux (August 20), the great 12th-century reformer, was such an eloquent spokesman for the guardian angels that angelic devotion assumed its current form in his day.

**Santo de la semana: Octubre 2
Santos Ángeles Custodios**

El concepto de un ángel guardian para guiar y nutrir a cada ser humano es un desarrollo de la doctrina católica y la piedad basada en las Escrituras pero no extraídas directamente de ellas. Las palabras de Jesús en Mateo 18:10 apoyan mejor la creencia: "Mirad que no menospreciéis a uno de estos pequeños, porque os digo que sus ángeles en el cielo miran siempre al rostro de mi Padre celestial".

La devoción a los ángeles comenzó a desarrollarse con el nacimiento de la tradición monástica. San Benito (11 de julio) le dio impulso y San Bernardo de Claraval (20 de agosto), el gran reformador del siglo XII, fue tan elocuente portavoz de los ángeles custodios que la devoción angélica asumió en su época su forma actual.

“Lo que es esperado”

En el Evangelio de hoy escuchamos a Jesús enseñar sobre la fe y el servicio a Dios. El contexto es un diálogo continuo entre Jesús y sus seguidores sobre lo que significa ser un discípulo de Jesús. Jesús acaba de terminar una instrucción sobre el pecado y el perdón. Hay dos enseñanzas relacionadas que Jesús ofrece a sus discípulos cuando claman por un aumento en la fe. El primero es el recordatorio familiar de que la fe, aunque sea un poco, permitirá a los seguidores de Jesús hacer cosas maravillosas. Pero esta enseñanza edificante e inspiradora es rápidamente seguida por la segunda enseñanza, una advertencia acerca de conocer el lugar de uno en los planes de Dios. Los discípulos de Jesús deben entenderse como servidores de Dios y de sus planes. Incluso cuando Dios hace maravillas a través de nosotros, con nuestra fe del tamaño de una semilla de mostaza, no debemos buscar la alabanza. Nuestra participación en los planes de Dios es la gracia de Dios para nosotros, nada más y nada menos. Cuando tenemos la gracia suficiente para cooperar con Dios, el trabajo que hacemos no es más que nuestra obligación para con Dios como mayordomos fieles. Y, sin embargo, nuestra fe nos permite creer que lo que hemos ofrecido en el servicio a Dios, como sus siervos, se puede hacer que produzca el ciento por uno.
