FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT – MARCH 26TH, 2023

*“I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord;
whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will never die”*



Today's Gospel reading recounts another sign, or miracle, found in John's Gospel, the raising of Lazarus. As our catechumens move closer to the celebration of their Baptisms at the Triduum, today's reading invites us to reflect upon what it means to call Jesus the Resurrection and the life.

Into this scene of confrontation, Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus, send word to Jesus that his friend is ill. Jesus is said to love Mary, Martha, and Lazarus, but he delays his journey for two days. The delay heightens the drama and shows Jesus' obedience to God, who is to be glorified through Lazarus's resurrection. When Jesus finally declares that he will journey to Bethany, his disciples fear for his life. Thomas declares that he and the other disciples should prepare to die with Jesus.

The scene described at Bethany is a sad one. Martha meets Jesus weeping and saying that if Jesus had been there, Lazarus would not have died. Yet she remains confident that God will do whatever Jesus asks. Martha affirms her belief that there will be a resurrection of the dead in the last days. Then Martha's sister, Mary, comes to Jesus with the same confidence, saying that Jesus could have cured Lazarus. Jesus asks to be brought to Lazarus's tomb where he prays and calls Lazarus out from the tomb. At this sign, many come to believe in Jesus, but others take word of the miracle to the Jewish authorities, who begin their plans for Jesus' death.

Set against the backdrop of Jesus' impending death, many elements of the raising of Lazarus foreshadow the good news of Jesus' own Resurrection. Jesus, facing the conflict with the Jewish authorities, acts in complete obedience to God. In raising Lazarus, Jesus shows his power over death so that when Jesus dies, those who believe in him might remember that and take hope. Just as Jesus calls for the stone to be rolled away from Lazarus's tomb, so too will the disciples find the stone rolled away from Jesus' tomb.

With our catechumens preparing for their Baptism at Easter, the Gospel today calls us to reflect on Baptism as a dying and rising with Jesus. In Baptism we die to sin's power over us, rising as children of God. In Baptism we join ourselves with Christ, who conquered death once and for all so that we who believe in him may have eternal life. With Martha and Mary, we are called to profess our belief that Jesus is indeed the Resurrection and the life. Loyola Press

*Yo soy la resurrección y la vida, dice el Señor;
el que cree en mí no morirá para siempre”*

La lectura del Evangelio de hoy relata otra señal, o milagro, que se encuentra en el Evangelio de Juan, la resurrección de Lázaro. A medida que nuestros catecúmenos se acercan a la celebración de sus Bautismos en el Triduo, la lectura de hoy nos invita a reflexionar sobre lo que significa llamar a Jesús la Resurrección y la vida.

En esta escena de confrontación, María y Marta, las hermanas de Lázaro, envían un mensaje a Jesús de que su amigo está enfermo. Se dice que Jesús amaba mucho María, Marta y Lázaro, pero retrasa su viaje dos días. La demora aumenta el drama y muestra la obediencia de Jesús a Dios, quien será glorificado por la resurrección de Lázaro. Cuando Jesús finalmente declara que viajará a Betania, sus discípulos temen por su vida. Tomás declara que él y los otros discípulos deben prepararse para morir con Jesús.

La escena descrita en Betania es triste. Marta se encuentra con Jesús llorando y diciendo que si Jesús hubiera estado allí, Lázaro no habría muerto. Sin embargo, sigue confiando en que Dios hará todo lo que Jesús le pida. Martha afirma su creencia de que habrá una resurrección de los muertos en los últimos días. Entonces la hermana de Marta, María, se acerca a Jesús con la misma confianza, diciendo que Jesús pudo haber curado a Lázaro. Jesús pide que lo lleven a la tumba de Lázaro donde ora y llama a Lázaro fuera de la tumba. Ante esta señal, muchos llegan a creer en Jesús, pero otros llevan la palabra del milagro a las autoridades judías, quienes inician sus planes para la muerte de Jesús.

Con el telón de fondo de la muerte inminente de Jesús, muchos elementos de la resurrección de Lázaro presagian las buenas nuevas de la propia resurrección de Jesús. Jesús, ante el conflicto con las autoridades judías, actúa en completa obediencia a Dios. Al resucitar a Lázaro, Jesús muestra su poder sobre la muerte para que cuando Jesús muera, aquellos que creen en él puedan recordarlo y tener esperanza. Así como Jesús pide que se quite la piedra de la tumba de Lázaro, así también los discípulos encontrarán que se quita la piedra de la tumba de Jesús.

Con nuestros catecúmenos preparándose para su Bautismo en Pascua, el Evangelio de hoy nos llama a reflexionar sobre el Bautismo como un morir y resucitar con Jesús. En el Bautismo morimos al poder del pecado sobre nosotros, resucitando como hijos de Dios. En el Bautismo nos unimos a Cristo, que venció la muerte de una vez por todas para que los que creemos en él tengamos la vida eterna. Con Marta y María, estamos llamados a profesar nuestra creencia de que Jesús es ciertamente la Resurrección y la vida.


