SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME— JULY 23RD, 2023

“GATHER THE WHEAT INTO MY BARN”



In today's Gospel, Jesus offers three parables to describe the Kingdom of Heaven. He also explains why he speaks to the crowds in parables. This reading is a continuation of Jesus' discourse that we began reading last Sunday.

All three parables use commonplace experiences to describe aspects of the Kingdom of Heaven. The first parable is longer and more detailed than the next two, and it alerts us to the two-fold reality of the Kingdom of Heaven. The beginnings of the Kingdom of Heaven can be found in this world. The fruition of the Kingdom of Heaven, however, will not be realized until the final judgment. In the meantime, as Jesus' explanation to the disciples cautions, any effort to judge the progress of the Kingdom of Heaven is premature. Only God, in the final judgment, will distinguish the fruit of the Kingdom of Heaven and offer its reward.

The second and third parables call to our attention the abundance that will result from the small beginnings of the Kingdom of Heaven. Just as a mustard seed—the smallest of all seeds—will become a large bush, so too God will bring his Kingdom to full bloom. As a small amount of yeast will leaven the entire batch of bread, so too God will bring about the expansion of his Kingdom. In each case the image is of the superabundance that God brings out of even the smallest of signs of the Kingdom.

Contained within these parables are words of caution as well as words of consolation. In the parable of the sower we are warned against judging others. To judge and uproot the “weeds” prematurely will harm the wheat; final judgment rests with God. In the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast, we are consoled by the message that God can work wonders and produce abundance from even the smallest beginnings of the Kingdom of Heaven.

“ALMACENEN EL TRIGO EN MI GRANERO ”

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús ofrece tres parábolas para describir el Reino de los Cielos. También explica por qué habla a la multitud en parábolas. Esta lectura es una continuación del discurso de Jesús que comenzamos a leer el domingo pasado.

Las tres parábolas usan experiencias comunes para describir aspectos del Reino de los Cielos. La primera parábola es más larga y detallada que las dos siguientes, y nos alerta sobre la doble realidad del Reino de los Cielos. Los comienzos del Reino de los Cielos se pueden encontrar en este mundo. El fruto del Reino de los Cielos, sin embargo, no se realizará hasta el juicio final. Mientras tanto, como advierte la explicación de Jesús a los discípulos, cualquier esfuerzo por juzgar el progreso del Reino de los Cielos es prematuro. Sólo Dios, en el juicio final, distinguirá el fruto del Reino de los Cielos y ofrecerá su recompensa.

La segunda y tercera parábolas llaman nuestra atención sobre la abundancia que resultará de los pequeños comienzos del Reino de los Cielos. Así como una semilla de mostaza, la más pequeña de todas las semillas, se convertirá en un arbusto grande, así también Dios hará que su Reino florezca por completo. Así como una pequeña cantidad de levadura fermentará toda la masa de pan, así también Dios llevará a cabo la expansión de su Reino. En cada caso la imagen es de la sobreabundancia que Dios saca hasta del más pequeño de los signos del Reino.

Dentro de estas parábolas hay palabras de advertencia así como palabras de consuelo. En la parábola del sembrador se nos advierte que no juzguemos a los demás. Juzgar y arrancar prematuramente la “cizaña” dañará al trigo; el juicio final recae en Dios. En las parábolas de la semilla de mostaza y la levadura, nos consuela el mensaje de que Dios puede hacer maravillas y producir abundancia incluso desde los comienzos más pequeños del Reino de los Cielos.


