SOLEMNITY OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL – JULY 14TH 2024 “YOUR HEAD RISES UPON YOU LIKE CARMEL” SONGS 5,7

On one side of the mountaintop, the priests of Baal stood next to the stone altar dedicated to their false god. They had been praying aloud all day, but no god had answered them. On the other side, the prophet Elijah stood alone next to a stone altar dedicated to the Lord God, Yahweh. That day Yahweh sent fire from heaven onto the altar, proving that he, Yahweh, was the one true God. The Old Testament records this showdown on Mount Carmel in northern Palestine (1 Kings 18:16–39).

During the many centuries between that event and the year 1156, people who wanted a quiet place to pray and to live close to God began to come together on Mount Carmel. A large monastery was built there to honor the Mother of God. The members of the monastery were called Carmelites.

In 1251, according to the tradition of the Carmelites, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Simon Stock, the sixth general, or person in charge of the Carmelite Order, and gave him a scapular. The scapular was a long piece of cloth worn over the shoulders and hanging, in front and in back, down to the ankles. After that, all the members of that Carmelite community wore scapulars. Today some religious men and women still wear the full scapular. Some people wear a small scapular made of two small pieces of cloth connected by narrow cord or braid. It, too, is worn over the shoulders. Wearing a scapular medal or the shortened scapular is a way of honoring the Blessed Mother. July 16 is a major feast for all Carmelite priests and sisters.

Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus sent out the Twelve. These twelve were selected from among Jesus' disciples and named by Mark in chapter 3. Mark notes that these twelve are also called "apostles." The word *apostle* means "one who is sent." The number twelve is also a symbolic number, representing the twelve tribes of Israel. By naming twelve apostles, Jesus shows his mission to be in continuity with the mission of God's people, Israel.

Jesus' instructions to the apostles are very specific. He repeats the mission that they are sent to preach and to share his authority to heal and to drive out demons. Jesus sends them in pairs, establishing his mission as a communal endeavor. Jesus also instructs them to travel lightly, without the customary food, money, and extra set of clothes. These instructions mean that the Twelve will be dependent on the hospitality of others, just as Jesus depended on others to provide for his needs.

Jesus continues to send us into the world as his disciples. But like the first disciples, we are not sent alone. Jesus has given us the community of the Church, which strengthens our life of discipleship. The Christian message can only authentically be proclaimed in and through the community of faith that is the Church. In our work with others, we build this community of faith and can invite others to share in it.

El evangelio de Marcos nos dice que Jesús envió a los Doce. Estos doce fueron seleccionados de entre los discípulos de Jesús y Marcos los nombró en el capítulo 3. Marcos señala que a estos doce también se les llama

"apóstoles". La palabra apóstol significa "el que es enviado". El número doce también es un número simbólico que representa las doce tribus de Israel. Al nombrar doce apóstoles, Jesús muestra que su misión está en continuidad con la misión del pueblo de Dios, Israel.

Las instrucciones de Jesús a los apóstoles son muy específicas. Repite la misión que son enviados a predicar y compartir su autoridad para sanar y expulsar demonios. Jesús los envía en parejas, estableciendo su misión como un esfuerzo comunitario. Jesús también les instruye a viajar livianos, sin la comida, el dinero y la ropa extra habituales. Estas instrucciones significan que los Doce dependerán de la hospitalidad de los demás, así como Jesús dependió de los demás para satisfacer sus necesidades.

Jesús continúa enviándonos al mundo como sus discípulos. Pero como los primeros discípulos, no somos enviados solos. Jesús nos ha dado la comunidad de la Iglesia, que fortalece nuestra vida de discipulado. El mensaje cristiano sólo puede ser proclamado auténticamente en y a través de la comunidad de fe que es la Iglesia. En nuestro trabajo con otros, construimos esta comunidad de fe y podemos invitar a otros a compartirla.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK: JULY 19TH:
 SAINT MACRINA, THE YOUNGER.**

Our venerable mother, Saint **Macrina the Younger** (also *Makrina*), was born in Cappadocia at the beginning of the fourth century. She is called *righteous* and *wonder-worker*.

St. Macrina was born to a holy family: her parents were Ss. Basil the Elder and Emily; four of her nine brothers and sisters are commemorated as saints: Basil the Great, Peter of Sebaste, Gregory of Nyssa, and Theosebia the Deaconess; her grandmother, for whom she was named, is commemorated as St. Macrina the Elder.



Macrina greatly influenced her younger brother Peter in his religious training, directing him toward a spiritual and ascetic life. After her siblings grew up and the death of her father, she convinced her mother to take monastic vows with her. Following her mother's death, she led the nuns in the monastery. She died in 379/380 and was buried in a grave shared with her parents, with a eulogy by her younger brother, St. Gregory. He also wrote *The Life of St. Macrina*.
