In this today's Gospel, we read the report of the return of the Twelve, who were sent by Jesus to preach repentance, heal the sick, and drive out demons. When the Twelve return to Jesus, he invites them to come away from the crowds and rest. But the crowds will not give them peace. As the Twelve have shared in Jesus' ministry, they now appear to share in his popularity. The crowds continue to approach them, and Mark reports that the disciples don't even have time to eat. In an effort to get away, Jesus and his disciples board a boat in hopes of finding a deserted place. But the crowds notice this and arrive ahead of them. The crowds are so persistent that Jesus and his disciples cannot find a place to be alone. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus is moved with pity and begins to teach the crowds.

In today's Gospel, we hear the Twelve referred to as "apostles." The word *apostle* is a Greek word meaning "one who is sent." Jesus chose twelve men from among his disciples whom he sent to share in his ministry of preaching and healing. The first report of this is found in the third chapter of Mark's Gospel, where the Twelve are also called apostles and the names of this select group are listed.

We who are Jesus' disciples today have also been sent to share the Gospel with others. Perhaps our commitment to following Jesus as his disciple leaves us feeling tired and overwhelmed. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm the importance of times of rest and renewal. Jesus wanted his disciples to come away and spend time alone with him. This is what we seek and find in our life of prayer and in our celebration of the Eucharist.

XVI DOMINGO ORDINARIO 'B' CUANDO JESÚS DESEMBARCÓ, VIO UNA NUMEROSA MULTITUD QUE LO ESTABA ESPERANDO Y SE COMPÀDECIO DE ELLOS. MC. 6, 34

En este evangelio de hoy leemos el informe del regreso de los Doce, quienes fueron enviados por Jesús para predicar el arrepentimiento, sanar a los enfermos y expulsar demonios. Cuando los Doce regresan a Jesús, él los invita a alejarse de la multitud y descansar. Pero la multitud no les dará paz. Así como los Doce participaron en el ministerio de Jesús, ahora parecen compartir su popularidad. La multitud continúa acercándose a ellos y Marcos informa que los discípulos ni siquiera tienen tiempo para comer. En un esfuerzo por escapar, Jesús y sus discípulos abordan un barco con la esperanza de encontrar un lugar deserto. Pero la multitud se da cuenta y llega antes que ellos. Las multitudes son tan persistentes que Jesús y sus discípulos no pueden encontrar un lugar donde estar solos. El Evangelio de Marcos nos dice que Jesús se compadece y comienza a enseñar a la multitud.

En el Evangelio de hoy escuchamos referirse a los Doce como “apóstoles”. La palabra apóstol es una palabra griega que significa “el que es enviado”. Jesús escogió a doce hombres de entre sus discípulos a quienes envió para compartir su ministerio de predicación y curación. El primer relato de esto se encuentra en el tercer capítulo del Evangelio de Marcos, donde los Doce también son llamados apóstoles y se enumeran los nombres de este grupo selecto.

Nosotros, que hoy somos discípulos de Jesús, también hemos sido enviados a compartir el Evangelio con otros. Quizás nuestro compromiso de seguir a Jesús como su discípulo nos haga sentir cansados y abrumados. En el Evangelio de hoy escuchamos a Jesús afirmar la importancia de los tiempos de descanso y renovación. Jesús quería que sus discípulos vinieran y pasaran tiempo a solas con él. Esto es lo que buscamos y encontramos en nuestra vida de oración



SAINT OF THE WEEK: JULY 23RD: SAINT BRIDGET (OF SWEDEN)

The gift of mystical prayer, an experience of a special union with God in love, was given to Bridget. She often had visions of Christ's passion. However, Bridget was also very practical in living out the Gospel.

Bridget was born in 1303 into the family of a wealthy landowner in Sweden. She became a very good wife and mother. One of her eight children, Catherine of Sweden, was canonized. Once Bridget was invited to be the queen's chief lady-in-waiting. She lived at the court

for two years and encouraged the queen and king to live holy lives. After her husband's death, Bridget founded an order of nuns known as the Bridgetines, who contributed to the culture of Scandinavia. She showed loving concern for people who were poor and sick, and many people came to her for help. Bridget made pilgrimages around Italy and even to the Holy Land. She spent her last years in Rome. She urged the pope to leave Avignon in France and return to Rome. Bridget died in Rome in 1373.
