

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT -"C" APRIL 6TH 2025 "NEITHER DO I CONDEMN YOU. GO, AND FROM NOW ON DO NOT SIN ANY MORE."



Today's Gospel begins by reporting that Jesus is again teaching the crowds in the vicinity of the Temple. The scribes and the Pharisees approach Jesus, bringing a woman who has been caught in the act of adultery. They put to Jesus the question of what ought to be done in this case.

The Pharisees state clearly that according to the Law of Moses, those caught in the act of adultery were to be stoned to death. Under Roman occupation, however, the Jewish people did not have the authority to execute people; To answer the Pharisees' question, Jesus must propose an action that will be either contrary to the Law of Moses or contrary to Roman law.

Jesus avoids the trap, however, by offering an answer that was not anticipated by those who posed the question. Jesus, after writing on the ground with his finger, addresses those who stand before him and suggests that the one without sin cast the first stone. Jesus then returns to his writing. We can easily imagine the scene as the Pharisees and the elders disperse, one by one. Jesus has eluded the trap they had prepared. We might also give credit to the elders and the Pharisees who do not, in the end, claim to be sinless and worthy of passing judgment.

Left alone with the woman, Jesus asks where the accusers have gone. With no one remaining to condemn the woman, Jesus (the one who truly is without sin) sends the woman on her way, refusing to pass judgment on her and exhorting her to avoid future sin. Jesus' response to those who accuse the woman is more than a caution to us about making judgment of others. It is a profound lesson in divine mercy and forgiveness. As sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others and we would stand convicted by God for our transgressions. Yet Jesus, the one without sin and thus our judge, offers us who are sinners his mercy and forgiveness. Redeemed by Jesus' compassion, we are sent to sin no more and to live in God's love and peace.

CONFIRMATION RETREAT AT THE CARMELITE MONASTERY: CONFIRMATION SAINT NAME.

In Catholic tradition, a confirmation name, also known as a saint's name, is chosen during the Sacrament of Confirmation to honor a saint and to encourage devotion to that saint. The purpose is to be inspired by the saint's life. This tradition is a symbol of the person's commitment to living a life that reflects the virtues of the chosen saint.

Our first year Confirmation Class, had a retreat day on Sat. March 29th at the Carmelite Monastery of Our Lady and St. Thérèse in Carmel by the Sea. Fr. Jhonnatan had contacted Mother Teresita to ask if the class could have a visit with some of the nuns to talk about choosing their confirmation names. The nine confirmation candidates who, along with instructor Daryl Lyon, mothers Mrs. Cook and Mrs. Foley, and Fr. Jhonnatan attended this inspirational morning trip. The class met with Mother Teresita and ten other nuns, who spoke with the candidates about their own favorite saints, their religious saint names, and their contemplative life of prayer. At the end of the talk the



nuns answered some questions. The nuns seemed to greatly enjoy the chance to connect with our young students.

These are some of the testimonies from our candidates: Yazmin: Going to see the sisters helped me get more of an idea of which saint I will be picking for my confirmation. The sisters were very loving and sweet, and I hope I am able to visit them again someday!" Yaleria: "Meeting with the nuns was a highlight of my visit. Their warmth, kindness, and generosity of spirit were palpable, and I felt deeply moved by their stories and experiences. What struck me most was their sense of peace". Daniela: "Visiting the nuns in preparation for my Catholic confirmation was a truly inspiring experience. Hearing them speak about the different saints and their unwavering faith helped me see the beauty of living a life dedicated to God. Their words encouraged me to deepen my own faith and strive to follow the example of the saints in my daily life. This visit was a meaningful step in my journey toward confirmation, bringing me closer to God and strengthening my commitment to my faith."

Lunch in the stunning Monastery gardens, which overlook the Pacific Ocean, was the perfect finale to a day spent fully surrendering to the will of God.

V DOMINGO DE CUARESMA ´ "TAMPOCO YO TE CONDENO. VETE Y YA NO VUELVAS A PECAR".

El Evangelio de hoy comienza con el relato de que Jesús está enseñando de nuevo a la multitud en las inmediaciones del Templo. Los escribas y fariseos se acercan a Jesús, trayendo a una mujer sorprendida en adulterio. Le preguntan qué debe hacerse en este caso.

Los fariseos afirman claramente que, según la Ley de Moisés, quienes fueran sorprendidos en adulterio debían ser lapidados. Sin embargo, bajo la ocupación romana, el pueblo judío no tenía autoridad para ejecutar; Para responder a la pregunta de los fariseos, Jesús debe proponer una acción que sea contraria a la Ley de Moisés o a la ley romana.

Sin embargo, Jesús evita la trampa ofreciendo una respuesta inesperada para quienes formularon la pregunta. Tras escribir en el suelo con el dedo, se dirige a quienes están frente a él y sugiere que quien esté libre de pecado tire la primera piedra. Jesús entonces vuelve a escribir. Podemos imaginar fácilmente la escena mientras los fariseos y los ancianos se dispersan, uno por uno. Jesús ha eludido la trampa que habían preparado. También podríamos reconocer el mérito de los ancianos y los fariseos que, al final, no afirman estar libres de pecado ni ser dignos de ser juzgados.

A solas con la mujer, Jesús pregunta adónde se han ido los acusadores. Sin que nadie quede para condenarla, Jesús (el que verdaderamente está libre de pecado) la despide, negándose a juzgarla y exhortándola a evitar futuros pecados. La respuesta de Jesús a quienes acusan a la mujer es más que una advertencia para nosotros sobre juzgar a los demás. Es una profunda lección de misericordia y perdón divinos. Como pecadores, todos somos indignos de juzgar los pecados ajenos y seríamos condenados por Dios por nuestras transgresiones. Sin embargo, Jesús, el único sin pecado y, por tanto, nuestro juez, nos ofrece a nosotros, pecadores, su misericordia y perdón. Redimidos por la compasión de Jesús, somos enviados a no pecar más y a vivir en el amor y la paz de Dios.
